WATERTOWN, Mass., Sept. 2, 2014 (GLOBE NEWSWIRE) -- For the fifth year in a row, pediatricians ranked temporal artery thermometry (TAT) #1 in overall preference over any other thermometry method, including rectal, according to a recent survey of physicians. Of the 280 survey respondents, 35 percent ranked TAT number one based on overall preference, while only 16 percent ranked rectal thermometry as their overall preference.

"Pediatricians prefer temporal artery thermometry not only because of its ease of use, but because of the well-established body of scientific evidence supporting its accuracy," said Dr. Francesco Pompei, CEO of Exergen Corporation. "As a result, millions of patients, parents and children no longer have to endure the unpleasantness of rectal thermometry and other invasive methods."

The survey also captured pediatricians' commentary about temporal artery thermometry. According to one physician respondent, "I am a strong believer in temporal artery thermometry due to accuracy and ease of use.
